

QUESTIONS FOR THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF FILM, THEATRE AND BROADCASTING:

What do you consider the greatest inconveniences for residents and businesses for this event?

The Mayor's Office has reduced the footprint of this event significantly to lessen the impact on the local community. There may be some traffic congestion in the area, but residents will have access to their homes at all times.

Has the red carpet been placed on Dean Street and 6th Avenue as a security requirement, or because the location is MTV's preference?

The location for the red carpet was not MTV's original request. The City, in consultation with the NYPD, found 6th Ave and Dean Street to be the safest and least impactful area to execute the red carpet arrivals.

Has Barclays booked any events in the future that extend outside the building in a way that requires additional permits from city agencies?

Per Barclays, nothing in comparison to the VMAs is booked.

For an HBO production on Park Place between Vanderbilt and Underhill, the Mayor's Office asked HBO to show signs of community support because the production company wanted to film for more than two days. What specific event characteristics normally trigger the Mayor's Office to ask a production to show signs of community support?

The HBO show that had to document community support was a much more intrusive filming request than the MTV VMAs. HBO's original request was denied by the City. HBO later appealed the denial, and the mandate of community support was a pre-requisite for them being allowed to film in the community.

Although the event has been in planning for a year, there was no notice to the community until after the community boards closed for the summer. Will the Mayor's Office and the arena agree to reach out in a timely way to the relevant community boards while they are

in session before each event of this type in the future?

Filming takes place throughout the year, and details are continually evolving as the logistics are worked out. Community boards and residents are notified when specific details have been decided related to the shoot. A meeting with the community boards prior to their summer closings would have been pre-mature.

Why has the Mayor's Office avoided attending any public meetings about this event?

Have you attended any private meetings with members of the community?

The Mayor's Office has not avoided attending any public meetings. The office has been in frequent communication with the community.

QUESTIONS FOR MTV, NYPD, DOT, DOB, NYCPR, AND THE New York State

The Production

How many producers will be contributing to this event? Is MTV going to hire a community liaison with the knowledge and ability to navigate the event internally? MTV is the only producer. We have a community liaison team that has been working with local businesses, police, community leaders, groups, and residents around the neighborhood.

How many people are being hired to be in front of the cameras on Dean Street and 6th Avenue and what will their behavior be? How will they be managed during the production? Will they be loud?

There will be a casted audience.

How many production trucks are anticipated to be on site at the time of the event and where will they be located?

The majority of MTV trucks will be inside the basement of Barclays. In order to limit noise, MTV is keeping several generators below ground in the LIRR Railroad yard. There are also a few trailers in the construction cutout on Pacific Street and a few on Dean Street.

Where will the media be directed to broadcast from and where will their trucks be located?

Only three satellite vans will be present and parked in the private lot on Pacific Street. The rest of the media will be self-contained.

Are any of the areas where parking is removed being re-tasked for parking related to the production?

No personal cars are parking in those areas.

How many production trucks will there be, and where will they be located?

See above.

Where are limos going to pick-up and discharge passengers? What are the routes to and from the “off-site” location they are anticipated to be located during the event? Where is that “off-site” location?

For security reasons, we are not sharing this information at this time.

Will the lay by lanes on Atlantic Avenue and Flatbush Avenue still be used for drop off and pick up?

We defer to the city/Barclays, as we’re unaware what a ‘lay by lane’ is.

Will the arena agree to pay for additional enforcement to ensure that illegal parking is not tolerated?

Barclays will not be hiring additional personnel because they do not have the legal authority to enforce parking regulations on NYC streets. NYPD will manage illegally parked vehicles

How many arena patrons will be attending the event? How will they be managed in relation to the red carpet and the restricted area?

As noted above, the creative is still being worked out so numbers are TBD. In relation to the red carpet, all are managed under MTV’s control.

What will Pacific Street between Carlton Avenue and Vanderbilt Avenue be used for?
As of now, nothing is planned. However, if necessary, Pacific Street will be used as a resource to park additional production trucks.

What will the satellite uplink parking lot be used for and will it be surrounded by additional camouflage and/or a set?
Uplink parking is on Barclays property.

If fans arrive early, where will they be directed to wait?
We will be using existing standard operating procedure.

Is Dean Street between Carlton and Vanderbilt is to be closed? If so, for what purpose and uses?

Traffic and Pedestrian Routing

Which routes will traffic be sent during the different stages of the street closures, Will there be signs and traffic agents, and where will they be located?
For security reasons, we are not sharing this information at this time

Is congestion anticipated anywhere at anytime?
NYPD will have traffic agents in place to enforce the street closures and assist with traffic flow throughout. There may be some congestion on Flatbush Avenue @ Atlantic on 8/25 from 5:30PM-9:00PM due to the traffic pattern in place to accommodate the Red Carpet arrivals. In addition, there may be congestion on Atlantic Avenue between Flatbush & 6th Avenue while the majority of guests get in waiting cars.

Closing 6th Avenue for 3 days appears to be the most consequential single closure. What is the detour? Is the goal for the detour to route traffic down arterial streets instead of residential streets? Will there be signs and traffic agents?
The detours likely used will be to utilize Vanderbilt, Flatbush or Carlton Avenue during

the Red Carpet construction. NYPD will have traffic agents in place to enforce the street closures and assist with traffic flow throughout.

Which sidewalks will be closed when?

All residents will be allowed access to their homes at all times. Sidewalks in the immediate vicinity of the arena will be closed within the restricted zone outlined in the MTV community information flyer sent out today.

Where will the B65 run on days when Dean Street is closed? When will signs be posted at all affected bus stops?

The MTA posts signage alerts 24 hours in advance and skip stops for the B65 on Dean Street between Flatbush Avenue & Carlton Ave starting Saturday 8/24 through 8/26, 6:00am

What is the projected increase in response time from the Dean Street firehouse during the street closures and event?

We are working with the FDNY to insure they will not be affected in any way due to the MTV set up. They will have full access to all surrounding streets for ingress & egress throughout the live Red Carpet.

Construction

Where are the specific locations outdoor construction is going to take place? Is there any construction occurring outside the arena block, for example on the east side of 6th Avenue?

Construction will take place on 6th Ave between Atlantic Avenue and Dean Street, as well as on Dean Street between Flatbush Avenue and 6th Avenue.

Which nights will outdoor construction take place and how late will it run?

On 6th Avenue, the current schedule has the only late night on Friday, August 23 until midnight. Then again on Sunday night for a few hours after the show ends.

Will you agree to restrict work hours outdoors to specific times or limit the number of days it will take place?

The Mayor's Office has minimized the amount of time that MTV will be working outdoors in order to lessen the impact on the community.

Restricted Area

Please explain the procedure to pass through security and visit a friend's home inside.

What times are the restrictions to be in place?

All residents and resident guests will have full access. This will take place 8/24 at 7:00am through 8/25 11:59. The areas affected are Dean Street, between 6th Ave and Carlton. Also Pacific Street, South side, between 6th Avenue and Carlton Avenue

Who is going to man the barriers where access is restricted? Will they report to NYPD or MTV?

MTV and NYPD will collectively man the restricted areas.

Will any portion of Dean Playground be closed? If so, at what times?

The Park will have access in and out from Bergen Street as the Dean Street access will be closed. Half of the park will be closed on 8/25 from 2:00pm-11:59pm

What is the maximum duration of time during the production that residents will not be allowed to walk down the sidewalk or street?

Residents will always have access to their homes.

Are stoops and fenced in areas going to be managed like the sidewalks and streets, or can residents use those areas as they choose when they want?

The production will not impact any private stoops or fenced in areas.

Moving in detail in a circle around the event perimeter, where is it anticipated the non-ticketed public will collect during the event? How many people are anticipated and will it be difficult to pass on sidewalks in any locations?

The NYPD will control any onlookers arriving in the area. As a crowd control and public safety measure, the NYPD will maintain a clear path on a portion of all public sidewalks open on the day of the event.

Is the media going to be let inside the restricted area? If so, where?

Some invited media will be attending the event.

Parking

We have been told the scale of the restricted zone and the area on-street parking is being removed have been reduced. Can you confirm this?

There will no longer be activity on Dean Street between Carlton Street and Vanderbilt Avenue – this block will be unrestricted on the day of the event.

How many parking spaces are being set aside in the parking lot for the community and who now has access to them?

We're basing this on the requests we've received.

Is the deadline to apply for the parking still the 19th?

Yes.

How many arena patron vehicles is the event anticipated to generate, and how much parking will they require?

Because the arena is only hosting about half of its potential occupancy, the potential needs for street parking will be significantly minimized.

Did FCRC receive an override of the user restrictions for the parking lot from the State?

If so, can it be provided to us please?

ESDC is aware of the use and it is permitted.
